Housekeeping (BMP 318) - Housekeeping is EVERYONE’S responsibility!

Storage Yards

- All department areas must be kept neat and orderly
- All trash containers must remain covered/closed
- Store parts on pallets in rows for easy inspection (and safety)



Work Areas

- Develop a routine schedule for inspection and clean-up of work areas
- Wash down areas as needed to minimize standing process solutions
- Do not leave materials at remote job sites



Dumpsters

- Place all trash into dumpsters
- Do not throw away recyclable and/or hazardous materials
- Dumpster lids should be closed - don’t allow overflow



****Remember:** Regularly inspect equipment and vehicles for leaks and make all necessary repairs in order to reduce clean-up costs.

EMPTY CONTAINERS (BMP-313) - What is the procedure?

- Make sure the drum/container is triple rinsed (unless it held a petroleum product)
- **Collect** rinse fluid and try to reuse in process if possible (if rinse fluids cannot be placed back into the process, contact Environmental Services)
- **Store them properly:** Either within a designated storage room, “Empty Container” area, or label as “Empty”
- **Recycle/Dispose:** Deliver labeled drum/container at the Environmental Yard (include “empty”)



EQUIPMENT STORAGE (BMP-332) - Test your knowledge

TRUE or FALSE?	
ALL equipment being stored for more than 1 month <u>must be tagged</u> .	FALSE – Multiple pieces of equipment can be stored within a “ <u>Long Term Storage Area</u> ” in lieu of tagging each piece of equipment so long as specific requirements are met.
Equipment Storage requirements apply to ALL machinery that contains fluids that can potentially leak.	TRUE – Proper identification and inspection of stored equipment is key to reducing spills and the costs associated with their clean-up.
Equipment being stored <u>temporarily</u> falls under the Short-Term Storage guidance.	TRUE – Short-term storage procedures apply to equipment being stored for < 1 month. Equipment must be stored up off the ground and visually inspected (and repaired if needed).
Oil spills do not require clean-up so long as the equipment is on concrete and indoors.	FALSE – Equipment stored indoors on concrete (or similar surface) is EXEMPT from monthly tagging and inspection requirements; however, <u>ALL</u> spills require clean-up.
