What

Can result from both uncontrolled and controlled events.

Spill?

Can occur anywhere, including secondary containment or even stockpiles.

Spill Reporting (BMP 400)

<u>ALL</u> spills are called into the Spill Hotline number.



What if I work in the mine and use the radio system to communicate?



What if <u>no one</u> can be reached at the Spill Hotline number?



Do I report ALL spills?

Contact either:

- Immediate Supervisor OR
- The Command Center
- They will contact the Spill Hotline for you -

Contact an Environmental Services representative by using the Weekly On-Call List posted on the Environmental Sharepoint site.

Yes – <u>ALL</u> spills must be called into the Spill Hotline immediately after becoming aware of them.

Why Should I Call the Spill Hotline Number for ALL Spills?

The Spill Hotline Attendant:

- Generates spill reports and contacts Environmental Services for you
- Tracks all spills for internal & external reporting if necessary
- Helps ensure that all spills are properly cleaned up

Spill Clean Up (BMP 402)

Spill cleanups are typically coordinated by the <u>individual department</u> unless the Environmental Department advises you otherwise. ALWAYS ask for help if you have any questions.



In the <u>mine</u>, contact <u>Burk's Sanitation</u> if you need assistance. Burk's is contracted to perform routine spill cleanup at specific areas such as the Q points and fuel docks.

In the <u>processing areas</u>, contact the <u>Surface Department</u> if you need assistance cleaning up a spill.
