Morenci "Scrap" Materials

Don't forget - the job isn't finished until the worksite is cleared of all scrap materials **Scrap Conveyor Belting (BMP 339)**





Store

Stack scrap belting neatly or place in a designated bin

**<u>Do not store</u> scrap belting with trash, scrap wood, etc

**Remember - Scrap conveyor belting can not be thrown into the trash



HDPE/LDPE Recycling (BMP 338)





Store

At the recycling facility, store in individual staging areas.

<u>In laydown yards</u>, stack neatly or place into designated bins (must be sorted!)



- **Remember Scrap plastic shavings must be collected and either:
 - 1. Transported to the recycling facility; or
 - 2. Transported back to your shop for temporary storage prior to transporting to the recycling facility

Used Power Poles & Railroad Ties (BMP 335)



Sort

All pieces must either be reused or taken to the Enviro Salvage Yard

Transport

Reusing it?

Transport back to your laydown yard Unusable?

Transport poles and ties to Enviro Salvage Yard (designated areas)

Store

<u>Used ties</u>: stored on pallets <u>Used poles</u>: stored in pole racks

In laydown yards, keep used ties and poles stacked neatly when not in use

** <u>Did You Know?</u> — The black gummy substance you see on RR ties and utility poles is creosote - a commonly used wood preservative
