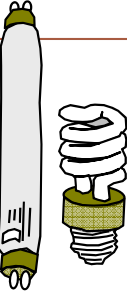


Environmental Share Universal Waste Management

What is Universal Waste?

Universal waste consists of used batteries (BMP326), used fluorescent & mercury-containing lamps & thermostats (BMP322), and pesticides/herbicides (BMP340) and are regulated by state and federal agencies.



What to know about Universal Waste

- Universal waste is not to be disposed of in the regular trash. Deliver these items to the Environmental yard or if the department is included on a weekly pick-up route send it with the route truck.
- Only designated personnel (Electricians) should replace or handle spent fluorescent and mercury containing lamps.
- Ask for help if unsure about how to proceed – contact the Enviro Yard Supervisor at 928-865-6697 or 928-865-7391.

What you can do.....

- **Used Batteries** – containers that fit small batteries should be labeled “Universal Waste” and “Used Batteries”. All Lead-Acid Batteries must be stored up off the ground in a enclosed area. Used L-A batteries should be deliver to the Enviro Yard for disposal.
- **Used Lamps** – store only in a “Universal Waste Storage Area” in a sealed lamp box to prevent breakage. Label as “Universal Waste ” and “Used Lamps”.
- **Pesticides & Herbicides** – must be stored indoors in a secure well-ventilated area. All unused and unwanted product should be taken to the Enviro Yard for disposal. Pesticides in aerosol cans should be deposited in the aerosol can collection containers.
- **REMEMBER:** *Leaking batteries, broken lamps, bulbs and mercury thermostats are considered "Hazardous Waste" and should NOT be mixed with the above listed Universal Waste. Contact Enviro Yard for disposal.*
