FLAGGING / BARRICADING



What can hurt me? FATAL RISKS

- Not using barriers or flagging where hazards are present but not easily seen
- Not flagging/barricading the hazard from all approaches
- Not assessing the hazard properly (example: using yellow flagging when red is more appropriate)
- Letting a hazard exist for an extended period of time
- ho Not giving enough information about the hazard on the tag

What can I, you, and we do to prevent injury? CRITICAL CONTROLS

- Ensure flagging/barricading considerations are part of your risk assessment
- √ Never only partially flag/barricade an area ensure all approaches are considered
- ✓ Use red flagging and barricading when medium to high hazards are present
- ✓ Only individuals with proper training and adequate PPE who are mitigating the condition are allowed inside a red flagged area
- ✓ Never leave a hazard for more than a day without re-assessment and evaluating controls. Re-establish tagging with the most current date when this evaluation is complete
- Always ensure a clear description of the hazard and contact information is listed on all tags

My critical behaviors:

- Assess risk appropriately
- Fill tags out completely
- Flag/barricade from all approaches
- Re-evaluate hazard each day and update tag

Red Flags:

- No warnings present in hazardous area
- Not enough information on the tag
- All approaches not flagged/barricaded
- Yellow flagging used in high risk area
- No re-assessment of hazard after each day

When in doubt, ask your Supervisor or Lead. Never just wing it! **Changing Morenci One Decision at a time!**
